





## **Census of Population and Housing - 2001**

The Census enumeration was able to carry out completely in 18 districts. These include all the 17 districts in Western, Central, Southern, North Western, North Central, Uva and Sabaragamuwa provinces and Ampara district in Eastern province. In Jaffna, Mullaitivu and Kilinochchi districts no enumeration was done. In Mannar district, out of 5 Divisional Secretariat (D.S) divisions only one was enumerated partially. In Vavuniya district, out of 4 D.S. divisions, one was enumerated completely and 2 were enumerated partially. In Batticaloa district, out of 12 D.S. divisions, 5 were enumerated completely and 6 were enumerated partially. In Trincomalee district out of 11 D.S. divisions, 7 were enumerated completely and 2 were enumerated partially.

The summary of preliminary results (provisional) described below relates to the 18 districts for which the enumeration was completed. These figures have been compiled from the summaries prepared by Census Enumerators and Supervisors and should be regarded as provisional.















To define a poor household, the following two indicators are filtered.

- Households belonging to lowest four per capita expenditure deciles.
- Households, which spend more than 50 percent of household expenditure on food. Then from the households so filtered, the households for which per adult equivalent calorie consumption is between 2475 and 2750 kilocalories are isolated and per adult average expenditure on food is computed for those isolated households. This average value is referred to as minimum required per adult equivalent food expenditure or M.R.A.E.F.E. The households (i) which spend over fifty percent of their household expenditure on food and (ii) for which the per adult equivalent food expenditure is below the value specified under M.R.A.E.F.E. are defined as poor households.

Note - Statistically reliable estimates could not be prepared for the North  
ern and Eastern Provinces.
